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Description of Course

Course Title: Library Media Center

Description: Seventh grade students will be introduced to a variety of print and non-print resources available at the media center. Students will learn to use the materials efficiently and effectively for academic purposes and personal growth. They will demonstrate their knowledge of information literacy skills through the use of exploratory and project-based assignments in the core and related areas of study.

Goals:

- Students will evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of their choices and uses of information and technology for problem solving and communication.
- Students will achieve information literacy by developing effective cognitive strategies for accessing, evaluating, creating, and communicating ideas and information.
- Students will enjoy and respond to literature as a life-long pursuit.
- Students will be independent learners who are information literate and strive for lifelong learning.
- Students will be responsible users of information who recognize the importance of using all resources and technology in a legal and ethical way.
- Students will demonstrate individual and collaborative inquiry.
- Students will engage in reading, viewing, and listening for understanding and enjoyment.
