# WELCOME

The Emmaus High School staff welcomes everyone to our Summer Learning Academy program. The following is a set of guidelines, rules, procedures and proposed course offerings.

## MISSION STATEMENT

It is our goal to provide a broad learning experience for all students. The Summer School program will not only include experiential course offerings for grade improvement / remediation, but also acceleration courses for students who wish to take a sequential course for which they have not completed the prerequisite. It will also allow students to participate in graduation requirement courses that they may have difficulty fitting into their schedule during the regular academic year. The expansion of this program will result in a greater academic experience for all students and help to ensure a successful tenure at Emmaus High School.

## COURSE OFFERINGS

All course offerings are subject to change due to the enrollment numbers and teacher availability for individual courses. It is within the Summer School Principal's discretion to drop, add, or condense courses based on enrollment figures. Courses will be offered in the following manner:

- **Acceleration**- A course that serves as a prerequisite to prepare students for the subsequent sequential course. These classes will be delivered via online learning. Students will be required to attend in person a minimum of 3-hours per week, per course. Students must pass the course, and score an 80% or higher on the midterm and final exams to earn credit. Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and Geometry will be offered for acceleration. These math courses meet NCAA Clearinghouse Regulations. In addition to the math classes, Independent Living and \*Microsoft Office will be offered for acceleration. *\*There is no longer a Computer Application requirement for Graduation.*
- **Accelerated Graduation Requirement Courses** - A one-half or one-quarter credit course that is a graduation requirement or elective course counting toward the student's required 21 credits and does not fit readily into the student's schedule during the regular academic year. Health and Driver's Ed: Keys to Driving will be offered via online learning. Students will be **required** to attend in person a minimum of 3-hours per week, per course. *Well/Fit and Aquatics require a time commitment of 90 minutes per day for five weeks, (Monday- Thursday).*
- **Remediation** - A course being taken to improve a failing grade between a 35-49% from a course taken during the regular academic year and earn the missing requirement (*No Credit Earned*). The student will be taking it to attain a passing grade. Remediation for core classes will be delivered via online learning. Students will be **required** to attend in person a minimum of 3-hours per week, per course. *Remediation for Well/Fit and Aquatics requires a time commitment of 90 minutes per day for two and a half weeks, (Monday- Thursday)*
- **Grade Improvement** - A course being taken to improve the grade from the course taken during the regular academic year. The student will be taking it to attain improvement of a low grade, but who has already received credit for the course. Grade improvement for core classes will be delivered via online learning. Students will be **required** to attend in person a minimum of 3-hours per week, per course. *Grade improvement for aquatics requires a time commitment of 90 minutes per day for two and a half weeks (Monday- Thursday)*

# REGISTRATION

## Opens May 9th, 2022

Students registering for summer school should follow the procedures listed below:

1. [Contact your school counselor](#) if you have any questions regarding courses for Summer School.
2. Complete the [SLA Registration Form: RESIDENT](#) or [SLA Registration Form: NON-RESIDENT](#) which will be available beginning on May 9th.
3. Checks should be made out to Emmaus High School. Please include Student Name & ID# on check.
4. Payment can be mailed to SLA Registration - EHS - 500 Macungie Avenue - Emmaus, PA - 18049 or dropped off in the main office between the hours of 7:30am - 3:00pm. Payment due by June 20, 2022.
5. **Registration for all courses closes on June 15, 2022 at 12pm.**

## PAYMENT

Payments should be dropped off to the 10th Grade AP Office or sent to SLA Registration - EHS - 500 Macungie Ave - Emmaus, PA 18049. Checks should be made out to Emmaus High School and must include the Student's Name and ID#. 50% is due at the time of Registration and the final amount is due by the first day of class. Payment in full must be received by June 20, 2022 or the student will be removed from the program..

Checks returned because of insufficient funds will result in the student's grade and credit being withheld until the payment is satisfied, along with a \$25.00 fee per returned check.

## GRADING

Any SLA course taken will result in a grade that appears on the transcript, just as any courses taken during the school year. All grades will calculate into students' GPA. This includes any passing or failing grades earned during SLA and applies to all courses (acceleration, remediation, NCAA, etc.).

## ORIENTATION

All students must attend a mandatory orientation as part of completion of Summer Learning Academy.

- All Students will have a **MANDATORY ORIENTATION** on Friday, June 17, 2021 at 11:00am. You will receive instructions on how to join once your registration has been completed and confirmed.

# RULES

## **Attendance Procedures - Traditional Experiential Courses (Well/Fit & Aquatics)**

Students must come to class every day. Because the Summer School program curriculum condenses the regular school year into a 5-week session, absences are not tolerated. Vacations and other summer time activities are not acceptable excuses and will not be tolerated as class absences.

Students enrolled in a 2.5 week course will be permitted (1) excused absence by having a parent/guardian call on the day of absence or bringing a note from a parent/guardian upon returning to school. Any further absence from a summer school class will result in dismissal from the course without refund or credit.

Students enrolled in a 5 week course will be permitted (2) excused absences by having a parent/guardian call on the day of absence or bringing a note from a parent/guardian upon returning to school. Any further absence from a summer school class will result in dismissal from the course without refund or credit.

Students are required to be in class on time. If a student is late for a class, he/she must report to the Administrator's Office immediately. A student is allowed (2) lates for a 2.5 week course and (4) lates for a 5 week course before it will be considered an absence. Once a student reaches their 3rd late for the 2.5 week course and their 5th late for a 5 week course, it will be considered an unexcused absence and they will be dismissed from the course without refund or credit. A student who arrives more than 15 minutes late will be considered unexcused and absent.

## **Attendance Procedures –Online Courses**

Students are expected to stay on task and on pace with their online courses. To monitor student progress and provide individual learning opportunities, students will be required to attend three hours of learning lab time per week, per course. The Lab hours will be from 9:00am to 12:00pm Monday-Thursday during the five weeks of summer school. Students who miss three hours of learning lab time will be denied credit for their courses. No refunds will be issued for a student removed from the program or denied credit.

If a student is up-to-date on his/her work, a flexible schedule may be established between the learning lab teachers and the student. In addition, students that are up-to-date on all courses may request absence days from the Summer School Administrator. These days are not guaranteed and must be requested in advance. Trip forms must be submitted.

# CONDUCT

Students are expected to abide by the Emmaus High School Code of Conduct. The discipline code can be found on the EHS website [EHS Discipline Code](#). If the student is referred to the Summer School principal for any disruptions or other disciplinary matters that fall into Levels I and II of the Emmaus High School Code of Conduct, he/she will be given one (1) warning. The next offense that occurs will result in the student being dismissed from the program.\*\*

Students are expected and required to demonstrate appropriate online etiquette when engaged in any virtual learning office hours or any other meeting with summer school teachers or the summer school administrator.

Appropriate attire is expected and required for all students while in person or in virtual learning office hours with summer school teachers, administrators or other staff.

## CONDUCT (Cont'd)

**\*\*If a student is dismissed from summer school, he/she forfeits all money paid to date. Money paid to enroll in summer school is NON-REFUNDABLE. If a balance still remains once a student is dismissed, he/she will still be responsible for that balance. If the balance is not satisfied, a charge will be placed against that student's record in the main office and his/her diploma will be held until all debts are satisfied.**

**ANY STUDENT DISMISSED FROM SUMMER SCHOOL FOR ATTENDANCE REASONS WILL NOT BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE CREDIT FOR THE COURSE OR OBTAIN A REFUND. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
