What's different?

- A/B Block Schedule (4 blocks a day, alternating every other day)
- Homeroom daily
- Different academic levels:
 - On level Honors Advanced Placement (AP)
- Mixed lunch periods offered in Block 3 (longer block)
- More variety in class selections
- Work performance impacts post secondary choices
- Larger and more diverse environment
- Increased academic expectations and greater personal accountability








Earned when you PASS a class

- **Private school students should have received letters regarding dates for online registration. An appointment for scheduling will be made after registration is complete.











Hornet Homeroom

Hornet Homeroom-In addition to one counselor and principal, each student will have a "home base" called Hornet Homeroom. This small group of students and one teacher will be meeting every day for academic support time and to build connections within the group. This time will be used to complete school work, get specific help when needed, and to make up work.

Hornet Huddle - Once a week on Thursdays, during Hornet Homeroom, the students and homeroom teacher will focus on community building activities that help to foster positive relationships and have some fun together! This is also a great time to have conversations about timely matters throughout the school.
