

## What if my child is eligible for free or reduced meals?

- Students who are eligible for free meals will give their student ID cards to the cashier to swipe, and the computer will recognize that the student does not owe any money for breakfast or lunch meals. To the cashier, it will look like the purchase has been deducted from the student's account.
- Students who are eligible for reduced meals will give their student ID cards to the cashier to swipe, and the computer will recognize that the student is to be charged the reduced breakfast or lunch meal price and will deduct it from the balance of the money that has been deposited into the student's account.
- Free and reduced students may purchase à la carte items if they deposit money into their accounts.
- Parents must reapply annually for free & reduced meals.

**Breakfast & Lunch  
Prices**

- The breakfast price is \$1.15 (\$.30 for reduced).
- The lunch price is \$2.20 (\$.40 for reduced).
- Dominoes Pizza lunch price is \$2.55 (\$.40 for reduced)
- In order to qualify as a school lunch at the \$2.20 price (or \$.40 for reduced), students need to take at least three of the five lunch components offered (bread, protein, fruit, vegetable and a milk), and one of those choices must be a fruit or vegetable. Students may take 1 fruit and 2 vegetables with their lunch.
- A variety of á la carte items are available ranging from \$.50 to \$1.85.

**How Does the Lunch  
System Work?**

- All students have an account in the cafeteria that can be accessed by their student ID number or PIN (Personal Identification Number).
- At meal time, students will enter their own ID numbers onto a number pad at the cashier station or have the cashier swipe their student ID cards to access their accounts.
- Purchases are deducted from the money in the students' accounts eliminating the need for students to carry money every day.

**How do I put money into  
my child's account?**

- Parents can pay with a credit card by going to:  
**[www.parentonline.net](http://www.parentonline.net)**
- Parents may send in checks or cash with their students. (Checks are preferred.)
- All checks and cash are to be taken to the cafeteria at breakfast or lunch to be given to the cashier who will enter the prepayment into students' accounts.

- Checks should be made payable to: EPSD Cafeteria Fund. Please include your child's full name and ID number on the check. For multiple children, include all children's names and ID numbers on one check noting the amount you would like deposited into each account. The cancelled check will serve as the receipt.

**What can my child  
purchase with the  
account?**

- Students can purchase any food item in the cafeteria — full meals or á la carte items.
- Money in students' accounts can be used for cafeteria purchases only.

**What if my child does  
not use all the money  
in the account?**

- Money in a student's account will follow the student every school year. For students who graduate or withdraw, parents may transfer remaining balances to another student, or parents may receive a refund check for balances greater than \$1.00.
