7<sup>th</sup> Grade Band Lesson Groups

# Description:

The small group, like-instrument lessons are an integral component of the "dual curriculum" in the instrumental music program. This instrumental lesson curriculum is taught separately and concurrently with the large group band curriculum.

#### Goals:

- To develop psychomotor skills and musicianship.
- To provide for growth and development of the students' individual performance skills and knowledge of their respective instruments.
- To increase awareness of the expressive qualities of music.
- To continue development of the skills, understandings, and values begun in earlier instrumental music study.

## Requirements:

Students will provide the equipment their participation requires, and procure the lesson material their participation requires.
