Course Title: Spanish for Native / Heritage Speakers 1

Description: This course is designed for students who are native and heritage language speakers of Spanish. These students are raised in homes where Spanish is spoken, and they possess a level of language competence that far exceeds the level of typical non-native students in the foreign language classrooms. While they may have never received any formal instruction in their heritage language, they have attained some level of oral proficiency and internalized some basic grammatical concepts. Although they may speak and understand Spanish, many have difficulty with reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

This course will expand upon the skills the native/heritage speakers already possess, such as understanding grammatical patterns and vocabulary of the target language. The course will expand on these skills, and will focus on challenging reading, writing, listening, and speaking assignments which will allow the students to explore more fully their own language and cultures.

Goals:

- To develop and expand on the knowledge that Spanish students already possess leading toward higher levels of fluency and literacy skills.
- To acquire a level of prestige or standard Spanish by developing meta-linguistic awareness about the differences between the standard and other varieties of Spanish.
- To develop an understanding of their unique Spanish dialects and cultures, and share those values with other native/heritage speakers.
- To develop language maintenance by studying Spanish in a formal academic setting.
- To develop the students' language proficiency by expanding their bilingual range skills.

Requirements:

• Students should speak Spanish, or at least understand Spanish fully.
