Dear Community,

I invite you to read about the remarkable achievements of our students and staff throughout the 2022/2023 school year. I take great pride in my role as the Superintendent of the East Penn School District, as it allows me to work collaboratively with our dedicated educators, staff, and community members to ensure that our district continues to provide a high-quality education for all students. Our East Penn students and staff consistently attain success within and beyond our classrooms. Throughout the pages of this annual report, you will find accounts of our students' outstanding accomplishments in academics and athletics, valuable district financial data and resources, as well as the essential community partnerships that contribute to East Penn's standing as one of the top school districts in the Lehigh Valley.

This past year, we worked hard to implement strategies to address the past challenges and remained committed to supporting our students and staff for the upcoming years to come. Below are some highlights of our work:

- **Safety & Security** - This year, we completed a comprehensive audit of District safety and security, including physical security of our facilities and emergency preparedness. Fortunately, the state budget included increased funding for PA schools to be used for the purpose of school safety improvements.
- **Instruction & Intervention** - We were able to provide a robust continuum of interventions to support all students. The District was able to sustain many positions through the use of ESSER funds, including 13 elementary interventionists and 8 secondary interventionists, who provide small group instruction and remediation in the areas of reading and math.
- **Social and emotional learning (SEL)** - Our school district remained committed to social and emotional learning (SEL) programs this year which held a crucial role in nurturing the development of our students. In East Penn, we believe that a comprehensive education extends beyond academics and encompasses emotional intelligence, resilience, and empathy.
- **Equity** - We believe in removing barriers to learning and commit to fairly distributing access, opportunity, and participation for all students. We will continue to engage in professional development that will focus on our ability to effectively engage in conversations around diversity, equity, and inclusion in order to create an equitable and welcoming learning environment for all students.
- **Facilities Improvements** - This year we created a facilities inquiry team of administrators, educators, staff, and community members to review current and future facilities needs for the district in effort to improve efficiency, enhance functionality, and create a better overall work environment for our students and staff.

The 2022/2023 school year stands out as a year of significant personal and academic growth for our East Penn students. My dedicated team and I appreciated the opportunity to collaborate with our school community in our collective mission to positively impact the lives of our students.

Aidan Levinson has been taking the world of politics by storm. This 2019 Emmaus High School alum has blended his passion for politics with a knack for technology to carve out a unique career path for himself.

Since January 2015, Aidan has been at the forefront of current political races, offering invaluable consulting services such as website design, voter targeting, and branding to local and state politicians. He has not only been instrumental in developing and launching websites for political clients and businesses but has also played a crucial role in helping these clients navigate the complexities of achieving their goals using technology.

From 2017-2023, Aidan's passion for politics landed him internships at prestigious law firms in Washington, D.C., Los Angeles, CA and even across the Atlantic in London, England, where he interned with The Labour Party. In 2020, Aidan was elected a delegate to the Democratic National Convention for President Joe Biden from Pennsylvania's 7th Congressional District. During the convention, he

was the Whip for the Pennsylvania delegation. Aidan was elected in 2022 to a four-year term as a member of the Pennsylvania Democratic Committee for Lehigh County, where he is a member of the Bylaws Committee. He is also currently the Senior Advisor to the Lehigh County Democratic Committee. He has worked in Congress, for two law firms, a technology trade association, and a donor consulting firm. He is now currently serving a two-year term on Governor Shapiro's Commission for Next Generation Engagement.

Academically, Aidan graduated Magna Cum Laude from American University with a Bachelor of Science in Data Sciences for Political Science. His academic commitment will continue at Penn State Dickinson Law, where he began his pursuit of a law degree in the Fall of 2023, serving as a Dean's Fellow and Honor Code Representative.

While his journey after high school has included a diverse array of jobs all over the world, Aidan hasn't forgotten his roots. Beyond his resume, Aidan emphasizes the importance of relationships and the impact one can make step by step. "Change only happens when you step in the arena." This philosophy has been the driver in his involvement in politics. "The world we live in is in an intense struggle to determine what the future will look like. It may sound cliché, but you have a huge potential to make a big impact. I always heard the typical 'you will change the world.' But the mantra I really live by is one step at a time. I try to make the biggest impact I can in the organizations and arenas I am involved in. People sometimes balk at the political angle, but the fact is change only happens when you step in the arena. I may not be able to solve all the world's problems, but I sure can do my part to make what impact I can and involve/support everyone I can in my community and state, and that's all I can do. If everybody did that everywhere, the world would be better off!"

As Emmaus High School continues to be a nurturing ground for amazing talent, Aidan's success story stands as an inspiration. He encourages current EHS students to never settle, to fight for what they want, and to recognize the potential they have to make a positive impact on the world. In his eyes, change begins with individual efforts, and he invites others to join him in shaping a better future.

# VESPA Virtual East Penn Academy



Since 2016, VESPA has been an integral part of the district's mission of providing accessible, flexible, high quality education for students in grades K-12. VESPA is a free, full-time, virtual learning program that allows students in East Penn to engage in asynchronous online learning from home. It provides an opportunity for students to pursue their education in a virtual environment while maintaining enrollment in the district. The VESPA program ensures that students are able to enjoy a comprehensive school experience by offering access to EPSD clubs, athletics, and events held in our school buildings. By participating in these extra-curricular activities, all students are given the opportunity to receive a well-rounded education in East Penn.

Upon meeting the Emmaus High School graduation requirements, all graduates of the VESPA program earn an East Penn School District diploma. This allows each one of our students to receive the same recognition as the traditional brick-and-mortar students.

The VESPA program is managed by a dedicated, supportive team of East Penn School District staff, including the Director of Educational Alternatives, East Penn teachers, school counselors, and support staff. The team is committed to delivering an educational program that prioritizes relationships and personalizes assistance to meet the varied needs of our learners. To encourage connection and a sense of belonging, both virtual and in-person support is available to students in our K-12 VESPA classrooms. Offering VESPA as a quality alternative to the traditional brick-and-mortar education is a point of pride for the East Penn School District and helps to meet the unique needs of our district's students and families.

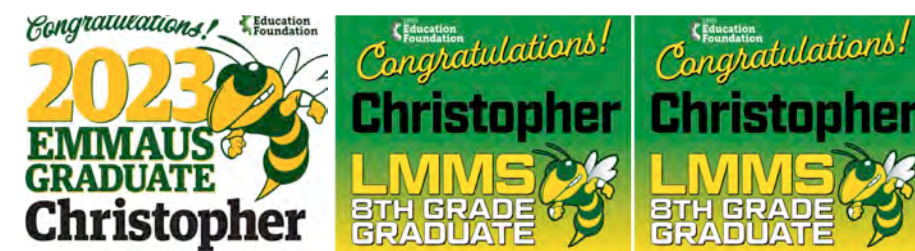
## 2nd Annual EPSD Education Foundation Golf Outing
